RVCTC CONTRACTOR MEMBER REQUIREMENTS FOR PARTICIPATION IN APPRENTICESHIP TRAINING

Current classes offered

- Carpentry (BAT registered)
- Electrical (BAT registered)
- Masonry
- RVCTC training classes are currently held at the Lincoln Park Technology & Trade Center,
- 535 Chickamauga Avenue, Knoxville, TN. 37917. Phone 689-1454.

Participating Contractor requirements & fees

- Contractor must be current member of Associated General Contractors or Associated Builders & Contractors
- Contractor pays a monthly fee based on number of students enrolled (see dues table below)

Student requirements

- High school graduate or GED equivalent
- Minimum age 18
- Must be physically able to perform the work of the trade

BAT registered

- Only RVCTC members may register their students with the BAT (Department of Labor Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training) (must meet BAT requirements)
- Currently, only the carpenter & electrical programs are registered with BAT.

Costs (Employer OR Student): (costs subject to yearly increase)

- Books to be used throughout the program (Estimated \$100 - \$400 / year)
- Knox County registration fee (\$115 / year)
- RVCTC Enrollment fee - \$50 per student per year
- RVCTC tuition fee \$1,800 / per student (if not working for an RVCTC participating contractor member)

Class schedule

- Applications are taken the last 2 weeks of May each year (**July 14th deadline for all applications**), for the upcoming September classes
- Classes start the 1st week in September and run through the end of May
- Classes meet 1 night per week / 4 hours per night, for a total of 40 nights/160 hours (BAT requires 144 yearly minimum)
 - Classes double up 1 week per month to end classes prior to May 31st, as classroom space allowed
- 4 year program- carpenter & electrical
- 3 year program- masonry
- Students are required to have 2,000 yearly work hours

Dues structure effective September 1, 2008:

- September through December monthly dues based on the number of students who enroll in September (see dues table)
- January through August monthly dues based on the number of students who are still enrolled on the first class in January (see dues table)
- Contributions for new participating contractor members are due immediately, once you have registered apprentice(s) employed by your company, based on the dues table.
- Beginning July 1, if you plan to place apprentices in the fall classes – pay the \$150 minimum until September 1 when new rate is set based on dues table.
